MONDAY, April 22

TO ENGLAND

Start on your London — Shakespeare Country Extension directly after breakfast. TUESDAY, April 23

LONDON

Medical Seminars are scheduled this morning.

In the afternoon, you'll be our guests on a half-day sightseeing trip which features the main shopping streets of London, Piccadilly Circus, Trafalgar Square, Big Ben, the Houses of Parliament, Westminster Abbey, and Buckingham Palace.

WEDNESDAY, April 24

LONDON

Medical Seminars are scheduled this morning.

The afternoon is free — shop along Regent Street, walk along the Thames, watch the crowds pass by on Trafalgar Square and spot everything from the top deck of a big red bus. You might even take in a play in the evening because theater-going is easy-going and costs very little.

THURSDAY, April 25

Medical Seminars are scheduled this morning.

This afternoon, it's off to *Windsor* where you'll marvel at the massive pile of battlemental towers and terraces which has been the residence of English kings and queens for over 800 years. Continue on through *Runnymede*, famous for the Kennedy Memorial; stop at *Hampton Court* with its fascinating red brick palace, fine art collection and magnificent gardens. You'll have a chance to muddle through the famous Maze (there's always someone there to help you find your way out!).

FRIDAY, April 26

TO STRATFORD

Say cheery-bye to London as you leave for your journey through *Shakespeare Country — Stratford-upon-Avon, Warwickshire* . . . set by the banks of the winding River Avon . . . it still retains the character and atmosphere of the Elizabethan market town that Shakespeare knew some

three centuries ago. Go through *Chiltern Hills* on your way to *Oxford* and visit the ancient University. Travel through beautiful villages on your way to Stratford. A stop will be made en route for lunch. In Stratford you will see Shakespeare's birthplace and Anne Hathaway's Cottage.

Dinner and overnight at the FALCON HOTEL.

SATURDAY, April 27

STRATFORD

Medical Seminars are scheduled this morning.

Following lunch, your de luxe motorcoach takes you to *Coventry* and *Warwick*. In Coventry, you will visit Coventry Cathedral, rebuilt from the bombed ruins of its predecessor. Continue on to Warwick Castle, a medieval fortress, well preserved and still occupied. Much of the town was destroyed by fire in 1694 but, below the stately castle, portions of the fourteenth-century town still stands.

MONDAY, April 22

TO JERUSALEM

Start on your *Israel Extension* directly after breakfast. Transfer to the airport for your flight to *Israel*. On arrival at Lod Airport, you will be met, assisted and transferred to the DIPLOMAT HOTEL in Jerusalem, your hotel for the next four nights.

Jerusalem: High in the Judean Hills is the Holy City of Jerusalem, heart of the Jewish people. See the busy shopping and commercial centers, traffic jams, cafes and art galleries. The city's heritage is seen in her diverse people, in her Holy shrines, her Knesset (Israeli parliament) and her famed Hebrew Univeristy, museums and theological seminaries.

TUESDAY, April 23

Your afternoon sightseeing will include such sites as the Shrine of the Book with its Dead Sea Scrolls exhibition — the Billy Rose Museum and Garden — the Kennedy Memorial — and the Hadassah-Hebrew Complex where the famous stained-glass windows of Marc Chagall will be seen.

WEDNESDAY, April 24

Medical Seminars are scheduled this morning.

Your half-day sightseeing tour takes you to *Jaffa* and *Tel Aviv*. As you drive along the narrow winding streets of Jaffa you will see St. Peter's Church and enjoy a panoramic view of the harbor; visit the shops and galleries in the Artists' Quarter and the Oriental Bazaar.

Continue on to Tel Aviv where — from the top of the Shalom Tower — you will marvel at the magnificent view of all Tel Aviv. Travel through its bustling commercial sector, residential quarters and cultural center; you will see the Great Synagogue, the Habimah National Theatre, the Mann Auditorium and City Hall.

THURSDAY, April 25

JERUSALEM

Medical Seminars are scheduled this morning.

The ladies might like to participate in the Optional Full Day Sightseeing Tour to *Massada*.

Leaving your hotel early in the morning, your motorcoach takes you to the *Oasis of Ein Gedi*, on the shores of the *Dead Sea*, and on to the *Fortress of Massada*, reaching the top of the Rock by cable car. This ancient Judean fortress, famous for its last stand against the Romans in 73 A.D., has become a symbol of freedom to the Jewish People. Professor Yigal Yadin has conducted extensive excavations, you will see the Southern Wall and Lookout

Point — King Herod's Palace and the King's Court — the Store Rooms and the Western Palace. Enjoy a magnificent view of the area from the top of the Fortress. Descend by cable car to the shores of the Dead Sea.

Return to Jerusalem and your hotel.

FRIDAY, April 26

TO TEL AVIV

Depart Jerusalem in the morning, drive through the Jordan Valley to Nazareth, you will see the Basilica of the Annunciation and St. Joseph's Church. Continue on to Tiberias, the city built by Herod Antipas and named by him after the Roman Caesar. A stop will be made en route for lunch.

Arrive in *Tel Aviv* and the SHERATON HOTEL, where you will be staying for the duration of your Tour in Israel.

Medical Seminars will be held in the afternoon.

SUNDAY, April 28

Your sightseeing today, takes you first to Haifa and Mt. Carmel. The view of the city, bay, hills and valleys as seen from the crest of Mt. Carmel is breathtaking. You will see the Technion (Israel Institute of Technology) and the beautiful Persian Gardens of the Bahai Shrine and the golden-domed shrine itself. Drive to medieval Acre. It is like taking a step backwards into history; this museum-city preserves, in its alleys and markets, a vivid picture of a distant past with all the mystery and exoticism of a typical oriental town. Many sites have been uncovered and restored and the ancient city is revealed in a variety of periods. On to Safed a Biblical town which became important after the expulsion of the Jews from Spain. Renowned scholars, among them noted Cabbalists, lived in Safed. The town is now a summer resort with exotic natural beauty. Visit old Synagogues and browse through galleries in the artists' quarter. A stop will be made en route for lunch.


